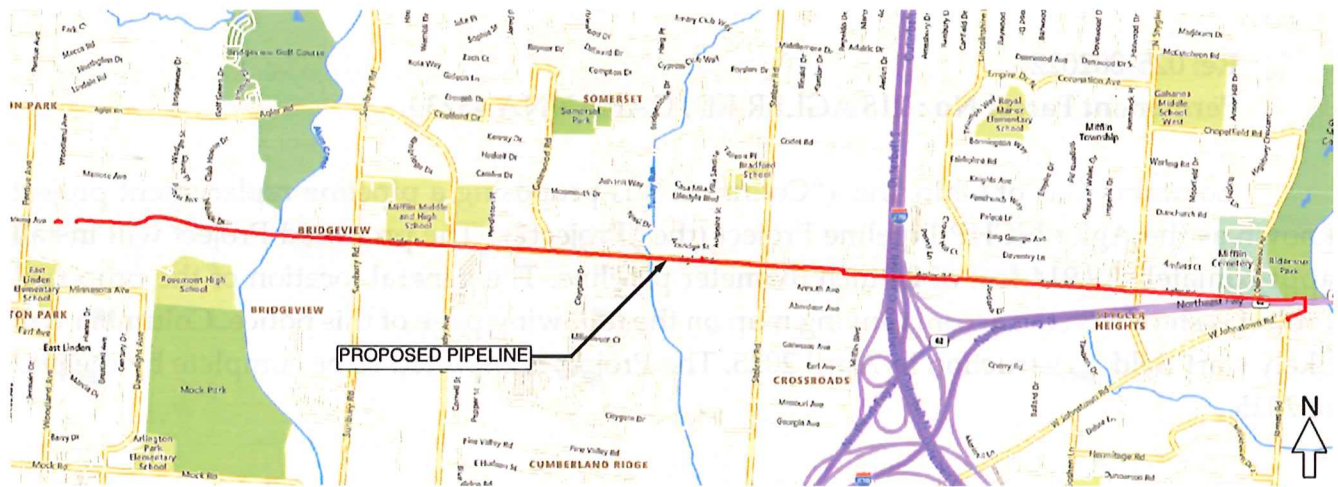
Columbia Gas of Ohio, Inc. ("Columbia") is proposing a pipeline replacement project known as the Agler NCHP Pipeline Project (the "Project"). The proposed Project will install approximately 19,914 feet of 24-inch diameter pipeline. The general location of the proposed Project is shown on the accompanying map on the following page of this notice. Columbia will likely start field construction in April 2025. The Project is expected to be complete by the end of 2025.

The proposal (called a Letter of Notification) to construct, operate, and maintain the new pipeline is now pending before the Ohio Power Siting Board in docket number 24-1126-GA-BLN. Interested persons may file comments or motions to intervene in this matter with the Board up to ten (10) days following the publication of the notice in the Columbus Dispatch. Comments or motions to intervene should be addressed to the Ohio Power Siting Board, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215, and reference Case No. 24-1126-GA-BLN.




Certificate of Estimated Property Tax Revenue

Use this form when a taxing authority certifies a millage rate
and requests the revenue produced by that rate.

The County Auditor of Franklin County, Ohio, does hereby certify the following:

1. On December 27, 2024, the taxing authority of Mifflin Township, Franklin County, Ohio, certified a copy of its resolution or ordinance adopted December 17, 2024, requesting the county auditor to certify the current taxable value of the subdivision and the amount of revenue that would be produced by 3.48 mills, to levy a tax outside the 10-mill limitation for purposes pursuant to Revised Code §5705.19(J), to be placed on the ballot at the May 6, 2025 election. The levy type is additional.
2. The property tax revenue that will be produced by the stated millage, assuming the taxable value of the subdivision remains constant throughout the life of the levy, is calculated to be \$250,000.
3. The total taxable value of the subdivision used in calculating the estimated property tax revenue is \$71,933,530.
4. The millage for the requested levy is 3.48 mills per \$1 of taxable value, which amounts to \$122 for each \$100,000 of the county auditor's appraised value.

"Total taxable value" includes the taxable value of all real property in the subdivision as indicated on the tax list most recently certified for collection and estimates of the taxable value of public utility personal property for the first year the levy will be collected as set forth on the worksheets prescribed in conjunction with this form. If the subdivision is located in more than one county, the home county auditor (where the greatest taxable value of the subdivision is located) shall obtain the assistance of the other county auditors to establish the total tax valuation of the subdivision.

The levy type is additional.
2. The property tax revenue that will be produced by the stated millage, assuming the taxable value of the subdivision remains constant throughout the life of the levy, is calculated to be \$350,000.
3. The total taxable value of the subdivision used in calculating the estimated property tax revenue is \$71,933,530.
4. The millage for the requested levy is 4.87 mills per \$1 of taxable value, which amounts to \$170 for each \$100,000 of the county auditor's appraised value.
