

What is Popup Blocker?

.....Call Here→→→ +1877-514-1396 A pop-up blocker refers to any [software](#) or application that disables any pop-up, pop-over or pop-under advertisement window that you would see while using a [Web browser](#). Some pop-up blockers may try to close all pop-up windows, some may remove all advertising from a publisher's [Web site](#), and still others may help you choose which pop-up windows you want to be closed with block list feature.

Examine the URL displayed on the push notification when you view these alerts. Be cautious if it does not match the stated product. These are probably originating from +1877-514-1396 a malicious pop-up source or a dangerous extension on your device, and removing one will not stop the others from appearing,

.....so a basic ad blocker will not get rid of them. Guardio is the only anti-malware tool that can identify the true problem and stop them from occurring.

.....What are the negative effects of these push notifications?

Push notifications are not only [Website](#) extremely unsettling, but they can also compromise your privacy and possibly result in identity theft.

Clickbait notifications, which merely aim to increase website traffic, are the least dangerous types.

However, frauds and phishing attempts, such as phony lottery winnings or financial incentives to fill up a survey or give feedback, are dangerous types. Personal information is disclosed when completing these surveys in order to receive an [incentive that never materializes. However, the con artist obtains](#) personal data that can be exploited in a number of detrimental ways.

The best course of action is to scan your device (Guardio provides a free initial scan) to determine whether malware is present on your device or whether harmful pop-ups are being sent to you via pop-up providers. If nothing appears, you are probably viewing unpleasant but harmless advertisements, which an ad blocker will fix. However, you should undoubtedly turn on *Guardio* to get rid of them if they do appear.
